Dear Mr. Hancock,

I hope and pray that you and your family are keeping well during this testing time for all of us.

I appreciate the challenging job you have being the Health Secretary at this difficult time for all of us and would like to thank you for the tireless work you have put in so far to deal with the pandemic.

I am writing to request you to consider the lifting of the lockdown in Leicester and Oadby & Wigston when you carry out your review and to inform you of a successful community to community messaging that we have delivered in collaboration with the local NHS. This request is in light of the reduction in the spread of the virus and after faith groups and places of worship have been working very hard to promote messaging to their members, worshippers, and wider communities they serve. We believe that we are in a different place than where we were 3 weeks ago and the places of worship and other faith and ethnic groups have established a strong messaging network with their communities.

Any local concentrations of the virus can be managed, we believe, locally via our collaboration with the NHS and local authorities. As faith communities and groups, we have worked with the authorities since March and recently, 3 weeks ago, we collaborated in a unique community to community messaging, whereby agreed scripts from the NHS are read out (in their preferred languages) in audio or video messages by priests, Imams, leaders and representative directly appealing to their members, worshippers, wider communities via their own social media channels such as whatsapp, facebook and twitter. This resulted in over 30 faith groups sending messages in 15 different languages to over 26,000 people directly in the high prevalence zones and many thousands more indirectly via sharing.

We believe that this, along with other action, has helped to contain the spread of the virus.

As so many people remain impacted by the lockdown, even after so many sacrifices being made, we feel that we now have the resilience to cope with localised concentrations of the virus in Leicester and surrounding areas.

By easing the lockdown, we will also allow places of worship and faith groups to pickup the pieces in supporting the mental and spiritual well being from the effects of this virus and lockdown. Many elderly people as well as many young people rely on social interaction that places of worship offer and we feel that by easing the lockdown, the communities of Leicester can start to return to some form of normality.

Of course, we will support the easing of the lockdown when it is safe to do so, but we feel that at this present time we are in a different place and have sufficient mechanisms to manage messaging on safety, vigilance and recovery.

I look forward to hearing from you soonest.
