Chair's Remarks

Dear Friends,

I would like to convey my thanks to all of you that are present today, the speakers, the hosts and all other faith representatives across Leicestershire that couldn't be here but support the work of the Leicester Council of Faiths. Also a big thanks for all who have brought lovely food and shared in the Food Festival and for our speakers for enlightening us with their views on the role of faith in a Multi-cultural society.

I would also would like to welcome a new member of staff that have joined us Karan Tanna who is helping us to deliver the Young Peoples Project funded by Awards for All for which we are very grateful. He will be working with many of you in the next few weeks and months.

We work across Leicester and parts of Leicestershire, connecting places of worship, faith groups and representatives from across the diverse communities of Leicestershire via membership and participation.

We have, with the great team of board members and our Manager, made great strides in undertaking a multitude of projects, activities and events that has increased the reach and impact of the LCOF. I would also like to thank Macmillan Cancer Support for funding the Cancer Project and Awards for All for funding the Young Peoples project. We continue to seek partnerships with all other stakeholders for their support, such as the city's MPs, the Lord Lieutenant of Leicestershire, civic leaders, the Police and Crime Commissioner Office, the Police and Corporate bodies so that we can sustain the excellent work of LCOF. Without further support, the LCOF will not be able to sustain its level of work. I am sad to inform you that Emma will be leaving us in December mainly due to lack of funding and continuity. I would like to thank her for her contribution and dedication and professionalism to the LCOF. I wish her well in her new role with the Fire Service. We will need your support to seek further funding to continue our impactful work. I want to thank all our members who have supported the increased membership fee for LCOF. Being a member is a belonging to the collective faith family of Leicestershire and a desire to be part of the success story of bringing people together and helping each other learn about their respective faiths and beliefs. It also allows us to work towards faith inclusion in statutory bodies and ensuring that faith communities don't face barriers to engagement and access. I and the LCOF board need to hear from you as to what you also want from the LCOF and feel free to speak to me or any board member about your thoughts.

There have been a lot of positives as shown in the highlights of the report with you today. From places of worship visits to meetings with Local MPs and holding of various Cancer and Faith events. We uniquely undertake this level of community engagement and dialogue to be responsive to issues but also to pro-actively work to benefit faith communities.

I would like to highlight the Cancer and Faiths project which came to a conclusion in which many of you participated, a project that exceed its expectations. So much sharing and learning was given, which will inform future approaches to faith communities and Cancer. The diverse attitudes and approaches to cancer was clear and the mechanisms for coping, for hope, for recovery had many common elements. Again showcasing that after all, that we are one human family and we feel each other's pain.

I am ably supported by our Vice Chair Narendra Waghela, Secretary Yasmin Surti, Treasurer Bharti Acharya, Assistant Secretary Minou Cortazzi and Life Members, as well as Emma (and now Karan) and the rest of the Board. I am proud to have such a committed and resourceful team to make a difference.

The past year I, like many of you, have witnessed an unfolding tragedy of monumental proportions in Palestine, Israel, Lebanon and the wider Middle East. With nearly 1,200 Israelis and over 42,000 Palestinians and Lebanese killed, the majority of them being women and children, we have witnessed the erosion of the value and sanctity of human life. With each passing day, lives are lost, homes reduced to rubble, and a humanitarian catastrophe deepens in Gaza and Lebanon with no end in sight and no accountability. As this tragedy unfolds abroad, its ripple effects are deeply felt here and across the world and as a result of which we have seen a marked increase in Islamophobia and Antisemitism, often stoked by those exploiting tragedy for political gain. As we participated in various Remembrance Day events in the last few days, this conflict and indeed other conflicts around the world, require us to continue to work with a common platform of humanity and peace, and promoting the values and message of peace of our faith's teachings. We should stand together and work for peace and not let these events divide our friendship and common sense of purpose to make Leicestershire and UK a better place.

Locally, we have maintained dialogue and I thank all those that participated in the touching prayer vigil we held a few months ago. We continue to support each other at these difficult times. There are still simmering trigger points between communities and people who have grievances, and we witnessed the riots that shook this country. We thank the Police for keeping us all safe from these rioters. We have a lot of work to do to ensure that faith and our common values of humanity prevail over hate and division. We need to build a more God-conscious world and work to increase spirituality which is sadly lacking today. We need your ideas and support to make this happen.

We need to empower and support young people and key influencers in our community, who people look up to, so that we can all play a part in making Leicester and Leicestershire a place that is truly tolerant and cohesive, which it isn't entirely at present. This means that everyone here today has a role to play and each of you are equally responsible for our past achievements and future successes.

I want to finish by saying that the LCOF is all of you. It is not owned by any one person or community and it is independent. We want everyone to feel that they can share their views or ideas or ask for support at any time. We will continue to help in whatever way we can, be it writing letters, doing campaigns, undertaking projects, making statements and so on. So please join us in our journey and let us build the success of this important organisation together and in friendship. I look forward to working with you all.
